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Introduction

The photographs of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen encompass the years from 1932 to 2001. They are organized in five series: Shows, Fairs, Miscellaneous, Members and Oversize, Mounted and Framed. The approximate **six** linear feet of the collection contain over 5000 images. The photos are sleeved, numbered, and stored in **eighteen** boxes and a few are still framed with no duplicates in the collection.

The work on the League photographs has been part of a project funded by a Cultural Conservation Grant from the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts. Other components of this project include the historical papers of the organization, slides, a collection of League newsletters, clippings about the League and its members, and other League publications such as brochures and postcards. The photographs described in this finding aid and most likely all of these materials will become part of the collections at the New Hampshire State Library Artists Archives.

The photograph collection is open for research with no restrictions placed upon it by the League other than a proper citation in both unpublished and published works. A suggested citation to these records would be “League of NH Craftsmen Photographs, NH State Library, series, folder title, photograph number.” **UNTIL THE COLLECTION IS DIGITALLY REPRODUCED PHOTOGRAPHS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO BE RECALLED BY PHOTOGRAPH NUMBER ALONE.** Copying of the materials for research use and reproductions for publication will be made according to State Library policies. Researchers are responsible for determining copyright status and obtaining copyright permission to use material not produced by League staff or officers.

The collection contains all the photographs believed to be in the possession of the League of NH Craftsmen. They were stored in boxes, bags, file cabinets, and closets in the offices of League headquarters at 205 North Main Street in Concord. Although there appears not to have been any formal policy on photograph retention, it is apparent that the importance of this material was recognized as so much of it was saved.

While the large majority of photographs were originally stored with no regard to order, some were neatly foldered according to subject, date, event, or craftsman’s name. Fortunately over 90% of the photographs, if not more, bear some identification—craftsman’s name, fair year, show name, shop location. Handwritten notes on the versos and typed media captions pasted to the photographs are abundant. However, many of these identifications have been made years after the fact. The most suspect identifications are of the dates of fairs. It appears as though the media often used photographs from the previous year’s fair for promotion of following year’s event.

Every effort has been made to identify unmarked photographs by comparisons to other images in the collection, but no research using outside sources, even sources available at

the League and in the League archives has been attempted. Unidentified photographs have been grouped by some unifying characteristic and foldered together. Anyone who has identification information should let the library or league know. Pleased do not write on the photographs.

Most of the pictures were found in good condition. A small number show severe damage, such as holes in the picture itself or large portions burned or missing. Some show the wear and tear of age with rips, creases, or crop lines, especially around the edges and corners. Some photographs are still mounted to non-archival board or framed.

History

There are actually two histories of the League—and each has multiple renderings and interpretations. The first is the “corporate” history: its founding, its goals, its growth, its changes, its struggles, its endurance. The papers of the League reflect the evolution and work of the League in great detail. A thorough study of them would produce an in-depth look at an institution that has successfully evolved as it addresses changes in New Hampshire’s economy and population, as well as changes in the craftsman’s world. Without the strong organizational structure and the daily attention to detail by the founders, directors, and its staff, the League would not have survived and continued to flourish in today’s society.

The second history is the story of the craftsmen themselves. Often passionate, the writings and photos reveal the commitment and feelings about the League of craftsmen at all levels, their creativity in the company of each other, and their contribution to the state of crafts in our time.

There are many “stories” of the League of NH Craftsmen. Each member of the League, each craftsman, each supporter, each volunteer and employee has a personal story, a connection, a perspective. The papers remarkably and colorfully reflect them all.

The League of NH Craftsmen, founded in 1932, had its beginnings in the 1920’s in two small towns in Carroll County—Sandwich and Wolfeboro. Mary Coolidge, a summer resident of Sandwich, helped establish the first Sandwich Home Industries shop. The shop sold handcrafts already produced by the women of the town during the winters to sell at summer fairs.

In Wolfeboro, A. Cooper Ballentine, a metal-worker, had started a program of craft classes. The two joined together and formed a committee to provide educational craft programs and to help market the crafts in shops similar to the one in Sandwich.

In a broadcast from Portsmouth, November 13, 1933 which was published in the Carroll County Independent, December 1, 1933, Ballentine stated that Governor John G. Winant “in 1931 appointed a special Commission to study and to develop the educational and economic values of arts and crafts in N.H. This Commission under the wise leadership of Mrs. J. Randolph Coolidge, has evolved into the League of N.H. Arts and Crafts.” Later in his life Ballentine made a point of acknowledging the contributions of all the members of the commissioners and evidence of their work is found in this collection.

The commission recognized the traditional products made by hand in New Hampshire homes as a source of economic advancement for farmers, foresters, and other seasonal workers, and as a means of preservation of craftsmanship that was being replaced by the influx of items manufactured elsewhere. Summer tourists provided a willing market for these unique products. The League of New Hampshire Arts and Crafts was founded in February 1932.

By 1933 there were 1500 contributing members, crafts classes in 15 groups, and 22 shops under the supervision of the League. Standards of workmanship were critical.

The first craftsman's fair, held at Crawford House in Crawford Notch in 1933, was a success netting \$2,698. There were demonstrations and sales as well as entertainment. This annual event has grown to a week-long nationally recognized event featuring over 200 craft booths of state-juried members.

By 1938, master craftsmen, some from outside the state, were recruited by director David Campbell to enhance skills and artistic sensibilities of the craftsmen. Campbell's twenty-plus years at the League led to growth and development. He worked to combine both traditional and contemporary craftsmanship; he established summer craft schools and traveling exhibits, and co-sponsored the founding of the New Hampshire Art Association.

In 1968 the League formally changed its name to the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, and for the next thirty years, the League continued to grow in membership and scope. The organization expanded its educational programs and scholarships for the training and refinement of craft skills, and instituted a state-juried system that is nationally recognized for its high standards.

In 1985, as a response to changes in tax laws which complicated the League's ability to be both an educational, non-profit organization and a source of sales for its members, the organization split into the non-profit League of NH Craftsmen Foundation and Crafts State Corporation. CSC worked with the local shops and the annual Craftsman's Fair at Sunapee. Initially the two entities functioned with one Director and separate boards, but eventually each entity had its own Director. During this period there were many changes in the way the shops related to the larger organization, their names were changed to Retail Galleries, and some chose to leave the League and go on their own, franchise, or close.

After 16 years, in 2002, the two-tiered system was dissolved, Crafts State Corporation merged with the Foundation, and the entire organization was once again known as The League of NH Craftsmen.

Throughout its history, education, marketing a product of high quality, helping craftsmen and keeping traditional crafts alive have been goals of the League.

Scope and Content Note

The images in this collection cover events, personalities and crafts from the period 1932 through 2003. There are some unidentified fair scenes that date back as early as 1930, and some photographs that go up to 2003, but with the advent of digital photography, and perhaps for other unknown reasons, more contemporary photographs have were not found in the League offices.

Most of the photographs are black and white, only a small number are color photos. There were surprisingly few duplications, and two copies of a print were saved, sometimes in different sizes. All the photographs are in sleeves and both the photos and the sleeves are numbered accordingly.

Photographs of craftsmen and works of craftsmen at shows or fairs are filed with those shows or fairs. However, that is not always the case, especially when the date of the fair or the name of the show is unknown. Likewise fair photographs that are undated fairs are usually filed with the craftsman's file.

Photographs of works by multiple craftsmen or of groups of craftsmen themselves are filed only under one craftsman. The names of the other craftsmen appear in italics following the name of the craftsman where the photograph is filed. This same method of noting craftsmen's names in italics is used to note where images of either the craftsmen or their works appear in the series devoted to events, such as Fairs and Shows, for example. Thus, all identified images of a particular craftsman should be apparent upon doing a word search of the finding aid.

Staff and trustees are noted in the italics also.

Series List and Descriptions

1. Shows

1939 – 2001

Arranged alphabetically by show title, and dated when possible. Images contain displays and individual crafts as well as some members and guests. Some of the shows included are not League shows, for example American Crafts 1981 at the Currier Gallery in Concord NH, which was a nationally juried show which contained League works. Starred folders include a promotional item for the show.

2. Fairs

1932 – 1997

Arranged chronologically according to both the number of the fair and the year it takes place. Contains setting up of fair, tents, booths, Craftwear, Living with Crafts, members' crafts, and attendees. As noted above in the Introduction dating of fair photographs was often done years later and media often used photographs from previous fairs for promotion. No attempt has been made to verify dates of the photographs and researchers are hereby warned of possible mistaken identifications.

3. Miscellaneous

1932 – 2002

Arranged alphabetically by subject and the shop subfolders are arranged alphabetically by place. Contains different programs, meetings, shops, seminars, and miscellaneous photographs of special guests such as Ladybird Johnson and Joan Mondale.

4. Members

1930s – 2002

Arranged alphabetically by last name. Contains images of both the members and the members' work. There are some folders devoted entirely to one craftsman or couple. These are filed after all the other folders for the first letter of the last name. For instance a folder for "Eppelsheimer" would be filed at the end of all the "E's." No attempt has been made to verify membership status of craftsmen in this series, so there may be photographs of non-League craftsmen.

5. Oversize, Mounted and Framed

One flat box of oversize photographs and large folders arranged according to the above series. Some of these photographs are dry-mounted and the mounts may contain several photographs. Large reproductions of already filed photographs are

marked as duplicates. There are three large framed photo composites that were used as a display. Some of these photographs are duplicates but some are the only copy available.
